

Common Apple-berry *Billardiera mutabilis*

Flowers: June to January.



Common Apple-berry is a twining scrambler that tends to grow-up through nearby shrubs, but not vigorous enough to smother its host. Will form a small tangled ground cover if isolated. Flowers are attractive yellow to green & bell shaped. Its fruit is oblong & noted as being edible when ripe. When soft enough to eat they fall from their stems. Apple-berry likes well-drained light soils, growing in semi-shade, often in more open positions. Requires moist soil around the root zone. Could make a excellent hanging basket plant.
