

# Silver Leafed Stringbark *Eucalyptus cephalocarpa*

*Flowers: January to July - H 8-15m. x W up to 10m.*



Medium size tree, usually under 15m, often stunted & crooked if the growing conditions are harsh. Silver Leafed Stringbark grows in poorly drained sandy sites tolerating moderate water logging, & is able to withstanding dry spells. The dense grey-green foliage thins on older trees. Thick, soft & fibrous grey-brown bark persists to the smaller branches, typical of peppermint gums. Juvenile leaves are a dull grey-green & round or ovate in shape. White/cream flowers attract birds.
